
**Topic: Black Politics in the Post-Civil Rights Era**

Danielle Wiggins is an assistant professor of history at the California Institute of Technology. She received her Ph.D. in history from Emory University in May 2018 and her B.A. in History from Yale in 2012. She is a former National Fellow of the Jefferson Scholars Foundation at the University of Virginia. Her research examines the intersections between post-civil rights black politics and the rightward-shifting Democratic Party from the 1970s to the early 1990s. In her forthcoming manuscript, she uses the politics of crime, welfare, and economic development in post-civil rights Atlanta as a lens through which to examine these developments. Her work has been featured in the *Journal of Urban History*, the *Journal of African American History*, *Atlanta Studies*, and the *Washington Post*'s "Made By History."

**Lessons from Little Rock**

Dr. Roberts is CEO of Terrence Roberts Consulting, a management consulting firm devoted to fair and equitable practices in business and industry.

A graduate of California State University at Los Angeles (BA) and UCLA (MSW), Dr. Roberts obtained his Ph.D. in Psychology from Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, Illinois.


For thirty years Dr. Roberts was a practicing clinical psychologist first in Deer Park, California and later in Pasadena, California. During this same time period he held several high level positions in and was Director of Mental Health Services at St. Helena Hospital and Health Center (1977 – 1983), Assistant Dean of Student Services at UCLA School of Social Welfare (1983 – 1990), and Department Chair and faculty member in psychology at Antioch University, Los Angeles (1993 – 2008).




As one of the Little Rock Nine, Dr. Roberts has been in demand by a number of groups who wish to learn about the impact of the chaos in Little Rock on the social, cultural, political, and economic life of citizens in contemporary America, this especially true at the Simon Wiesenthal Center in Los Angeles where Dr. Roberts is a member of the adjunct faculty.

He regularly consults with law enforcement agencies at the local, state and national levels. His goal is to assist their officers develop more advanced understandings of the ways in which some of their attitudes about different cultures are established by their belief in systems founded upon mythological constructs and supported by pernicious ideologies promulgated by those who wish to preserve a static social hierarchy.

Discover, preserve and promote the music of classical composers from the African Diaspora going back to the 18th century.

Some of these talented artists, such as The Chevalier Saint George, were the contemporaries and competitors of Bach, Beethoven, Haydn and Mozart. Yet they were blackballed, omitted, ostracized and spurned simply due to the color of their skin. As a result, classical music has been mostly the repertoire of European composers.

Under the guidance of Professor Janise White, Founder and Director of the Afro-American Chamber Music Society Orchestra (AACMSO), you will be part of social justice in the area of classical music that needs your kind and supportive attention.

Janise holds a B.M. in piano from San Francisco Conservatory of Music, an M.M. in piano from the University of Southern California, a Choral Credential from the California State University Hayward, and an A. D. S. from Oberlin Conservatory.

The Afro-American Chamber Music Society Orchestra (AACMSO) is the only orchestra specializing in the performance of Black classics on the west coast. Through systematic research, Ms. White has revived over 200 symphonic scores of historic composers.

In recognition of AACMSO's advocacy for Black composers, they are listed in the "Brass Music of Black Composers" by Aaron Horne, "Bibliography of Black Composers" by Dr. Rene de Lerma, and the "International Dictionary of Black Composers" by Samuel A. Floyd, Jr.

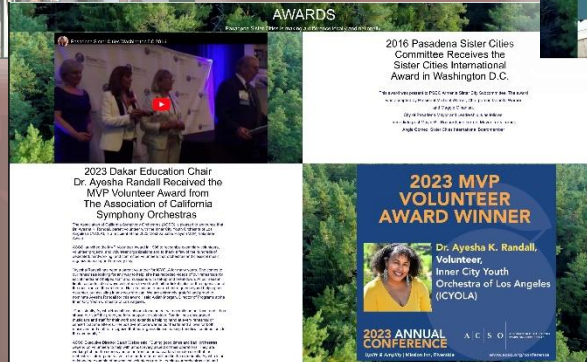

- Malaria medication is not mandatory, but it is suggested that the medication be purchased (approximately \$69). Talk with your personal physician for further instructions.
- Make sure your prescription medication is in its original packaging.


**TRAVEL DOCUMENTS**

- Current Passport. There should be at least 4 blank pages in your passport book. Senegal does not require a visa for U.S. Passport holders
